Although no action may be taken, the Commission and staff will follow up, at an appropriate time, on those items needing response. Each speaker is limited to (3) three minutes. Time may be surrendered by deferring (1) one minute to another speaker, not to exceed a total of (8) eight minutes. The speaker wishing to defer time must be present when the item is heard. In order to be recognized and present an item, each speaker must complete and submit to the Recording Secretary a Request to Speak form prior to the beginning of the item being announced by the Chair (forms are available at the entrance to the meeting room). Speakers are taken in the order slips are submitted.

Items in Consent Calendar Section A have already been considered by the Commission at a previous meeting where the public was invited to comment, after which a decision was made. These items are not subject to public discussion at this meeting because the vote taken at the previous meeting was final. Resolutions concerning decisions made at previous meetings are for the purpose of memorializing the decision to assure the accuracy of the findings, the prior vote, and any conditions imposed.





CALL TO ORDER

Chair Saul called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

ROLL CALL

The following persons were recorded in attendance by the Recording Secretary:

PRESENT: Chair David Saul; Vice Chair Chris Frost; and Commissioners Marlene Matlow, Meril May and Carol Randall (arrived at 5:08 p.m.)

ALSO PRESENT: Jim Thorsen, City Manager; Bob Brager, Public Works Director; Arthur Aladjajian, Public Works Superintendent; Brad Davis, Emergency Services Coordinator; Lieutenant Jim Royal, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department; and Mary Linden, Recording Secretary

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner May led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Vice Chair Frost seconded a motion to approve the agenda. The motion carried 4-0, Commissioner Randall absent.

REPORT ON POSTING OF AGENDA

Recording Secretary Linden reported that the agenda for the meeting was properly posted on November 24, 2015.

ITEM 1.A. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

ITEM 1.B. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Commissioner Matlow displayed a Gobagger, a device to help an individual to easily fill a sandbag. She suggested the City consider purchasing a supply of them.

In response to Chair Saul, Commissioner May stated fire stations are providing empty sandbags and sand for filling them. He stated sandbags available at Zuma Beach were filled.

Commissioner May discussed Waste Management bins on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH). He commended Waste Management for its immediately response to his request to move the bins.

Commissioner Randall arrived at 5:08 p.m.

ITEM 2 CONSENT CALENDAR

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Commissioner May seconded a motion to approve the Consent Calendar. The motion carried unanimously.

ITEM 3 OLD BUSINESS

None.

ITEM 4 NEW BUSINESS

- A. Emergency Preparedness Program Quarterly Report
Recommended Action: Receive and file update on the City's Emergency Preparedness Program activities for the period of September through November 2015.

Emergency Services Coordinator Davis presented the report. He stated the City was actively preparing and training for the El Niño weather system. He announced the El Niño preparedness event scheduled for Saturday, December 12. He stated he already had 40 reservations. In response to Commissioner Randall, Emergency Services Coordinator Davis discussed agencies participating in the event.

In response to Commissioner May, Emergency Services Coordinator Davis discussed the City's preparation for communications during emergency situations.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Emergency Services Coordinator Davis confirmed he could offer CERT training for individual homeowner groups.

Commissioner Matlow asked if Emergency Services Coordinator Davis would be posting information about training and programs the City offers on NextDoor Point Dume. Emergency Services Coordinator Davis stated the City's Media Information Office assisted with disseminating information.

B. Preparations for El Niño Weather Conditions

Recommended Action: Receive and file update on preparations for El Niño weather conditions.

Public Works Director Brager provided the presentation previously given to the Public Works Commission and City Council regarding the City's plans for before, during and after El Niño weather events.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Public Works Director Brager explained that both the City and Caltrans will have heavy equipment staged in Malibu. City Manager Thorsen stated the City issued a request for proposals for contractors that could be on call to assist the City with equipment and manpower. Commissioner Matlow stated there were individuals in the City who could also provide assistance.

Emergency Services Coordinator Davis explained the City's cooperative arrangement with the County of Los Angeles Office of Emergency Management for mutual aid. Lt. Royal stated the County's reach extended to a state and national level.

In response to Commissioner Randall, City Manager Thorsen stated private homeowners along the beach would need to hire private contractors to do work that would protect their homes. Public Works Director Brager reiterated the need for homeowners to prepare in advance to protect their property.

Emergency Services Coordinator Davis discussed the City's plans for communication. He stated the City aggressively promotes its various communication outlets, including the website notification system, Nixle, and social media, which would all be used to communicate information updates to the community. He discussed alternative methods of communication the City has in place, including radios and satellite phones. He discussed established lines of communication with the Sheriff's Department. He stated the City has plans in place for staffing around the clock, if necessary.

Public Works Director Brager stated the new restrooms installed at Las Flores Creek Park include storage space that will be stocked with emergency supplies for

the east side of the City. Commissioner Randall expressed concern about that emergency supply being located near a creek. Public Works Director Brager stated adjustments have been made to improve the creek flow and help prevent flooding.

In response to Chair Saul, Emergency Services Coordinator Davis explained the City's plan for staffing at City Hall. City Manager Thorsen discussed the City's One Call to City Hall hotline could be used for incidents that occur when City Hall is not open and the emergency operations center (EOC) has not been activated.

In response to Commissioner Matlow, Public Works Director Brager confirmed that the City has an emergency notification system in place. Lt. Royal stated the County also had a communication system in place.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Public Works Superintendent Aladjajian stated the City asked Caltrans to monitor potential slide areas between Las Flores and Topanga Canyon. Public Works Director Brager stated Caltrans cleaned the culverts in those areas. In response to Commissioner Randall, City Manager Thorsen stated it was unlikely Caltrans had geologists monitoring those hillsides. He stated the City monitors landslide abatement districts, such as the Big Rock area.

Commissioner Matlow asked about plans for areas susceptible to water sheeting and hydroplaning. Public Works Superintendent Aladjajian stated the City requested Caltrans add signage warning motorists about the potential for hydroplaning. Public Works Director Brager stated the City discussed El Niño preparation during each of its biweekly conference calls with Caltrans.

Commissioner May commended City and County staff for its excellent preventative work. He stated Caltrans needs to do the same along PCH. He stated he recently submitted a request to Assemblymember Bloom for additional funds for PCH maintenance. He stated he has zero confidence in Caltrans. He stated he hoped the City and County were ready to take over PCH.

Commissioner Matlow expressed concern about the Zuma underpass. She suggested requesting the sediment be removed. City Manager Thorsen stated the Los Angeles County Department of Beaches and Harbors could not make the necessary repairs due to resistance from some of the residents where work would need to be done. In response to Commissioner May, City Manager Thorsen stated Beaches and Harbors would not remove the debris under the bridge unless there was a complete plan for the area. In response to Vice Chair Frost and Commissioner May, City Manager Thorsen explained the processes and procedures required to clear the area.

C. Mid-Year Report to the City Council

Recommended Action: Develop a list of Commission activities from the period of July through December 2015 to be included in the City Manager's Mid-Year Commission Activity Report, scheduled to be presented to the City Council at its Regular meeting on January 25, 2016.

Recording Secretary Linden presented the report. She read a list of actions taken by the Commission compiled from a review of the Commission's meeting minutes since July 1, 2015.

Commissioner Randall asked if monitoring the implementation of the PCH Safety Study should be added. Recording Secretary Linden stated the Commission had not been tasked to monitor the study's projects, but Public Works staff would inform the Commission as work was scheduled and completed.

MOTION

Commissioner May moved and Chair Saul seconded a motion to submit the list of actions taken by the Commission since July 1, 2015 to be included in the City Manager's Mid-Year Commission Activity Report, scheduled to be presented to the City Council at its Regular meeting on January 25, 2016. The motion carried unanimously.

D. Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets

Recommended Action: 1) Receive and file status updates on projects affecting traffic on PCH and City streets, including: a) Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Street Maintenance Project; b) Wave Breaker Construction and Shoreline Restoration Project; and c) Caltrans maintenance work; and 2) Provide questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans staff.

Commissioner Matlow discussed the Point Dume Traffic Management Community Meeting held on November 12, 2015. She commended the City for an excellent meeting. She stated she requested the Fire Department publicly acknowledge the danger of speed humps on its response times. She expressed frustration that a majority still supported the installation of speed humps. She stated she requested the City conduct testing on Malibu Road to confirm the impact of speed humps on emergency response time.

Chair Saul asked what staff took away from the discussion of speed humps at the meeting. Public Works Director Brager stated the meeting was an opportunity for the City to get input from the community on all traffic safety options. He stated an additional meeting will be scheduled to present possible options for addressing the issues in Point Dume neighborhoods.

Commissioner Matlow stated Councilmember Sibert and Councilmember Peak should recuse themselves from City Council votes regarding speed humps in Point Dume.

Commissioner Randall expressed concern that speed humps would result in speeding traffic moving to adjacent streets. Public Works Director Brager explained the City is trying to develop a comprehensive traffic plan for the Point Dume area.

Chair Saul discussed flooding potential on PCH downhill from Puerco Canyon. He suggested staff ask Caltrans to install hydroplaning warning signs.

Commissioner May commended Caltrans for re-stenciling three crosswalks in the City. He stated Caltrans was doing a better job of maintaining the paddles near Las Flores, but many needed to be replaced near Geoffrey's. He commended Vintage Grocers for voluntarily installing bollards outside their store.

E. Public Safety Agency Activity

Recommended Action: Discuss recent Public Safety Agency activities and receive and file monthly activity reports from the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, Fire Department and Lifeguard Division.

Lt. Royal discussed scams currently victimizing many individuals.

Commissioner Randall requested discussion about the necessity for the left hand turn restrictions from Malibu Canyon onto Civic Center Way since the installation of the Winter Canyon signal be added to the next Public Works report on road impacts.



Subject: Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets

RECOMMENDED ACTION: 1) Receive and file status updates on projects affecting traffic on PCH and City streets, including: a) Point Dume Traffic Management Community Meeting; b) Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Street Maintenance Project; c) Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) Parking Master Plan; d) El Niño Update; and e) Caltrans maintenance work; and 2) Provide questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans staff.

DISCUSSION: Below are the latest updates on the status of projects in and around Malibu that affect traffic and public safety on PCH and City streets:


- a) Point Dume Traffic Management Community Meeting – In November 2015, the City held a community meeting at the Point Dume Marine Science Elementary School to discuss various options available to improve traffic safety in the Point Dume neighborhood, such as speed humps, signage, speeding, parking and other traffic related issues. Based on input provided by the public at the community meeting, the City will conduct a follow up community meeting to discuss possible recommendations in an effort to create a workable traffic management plan for the Point Dume neighborhood area.
- b) Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Street Maintenance Project – During the week of January 11, 2016, the contractor completed the asphalt pavement dig-out repairs on Encinal Canyon Road (between PCH and the City limits) and Busch Drive (between PCH and Rainsford Place). During the week of January 18, the contractor completed the rubber

asphalt overlay of Encinal Canyon Road (between PCH and Avenida De La Encinal). Slurry seal work for Encinal Canyon Road (between Avenida De La Encinal and the City limits) and portions of Big Rock Drive, Fernhill Drive, and Birdview Avenue are scheduled for completion during the week of January 25, 2016. The project is expected to be completed by mid-February.

- c) Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) Parking Master Plan – The purpose of this study is to analyze the existing PCH shoulder and develop recommendations to improve safety and mobility. The project consultant has completed aerial mapping and is currently collecting data, which will be followed up with field survey collection to identify existing conditions. Staff will provide a project update at the PCH Taskforce meeting scheduled on Friday, January 29, 2016.
- d) El Niño Update - The first El Niño storm hit Southern California in early January. Between January 5-7, 2016, Malibu received approximately 1.5 to 2 inches of rain. During the storm event, staff and the City's maintenance crews monitored and cleared City roads and drainage facilities for any potential storm issues. City crews addressed minor storm debris along some of the canyon roads; however, all roads remained open for the duration of the storm event. Since the initial storm, City maintenance crews are re-inspecting City storm drains and removing storm debris collected along the shoulders.
- e) Caltrans Maintenance Work (PCH within Malibu) – According to Caltrans, highway maintenance crews replaced damaged and/or missing center median paddles on PCH near Geoffrey's Restaurant and Heathercliff Road, repaired a pothole on northbound PCH near Encinal Canyon Road, cleared encroaching vegetation on northbound PCH near Zuma View Place, and removed storm debris on northbound PCH near Corral Canyon Road.

The Commission may provide staff with a list of questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans. Responses to those questions will be reported back to the Commission at its next Regular meeting.

Subject: Disaster Mass Notification System


RECOMMENDED ACTION: Receive and file overview on Everbridge, the City's new mass notification system for disaster situations.

DISCUSSION: The City recently contracted with Everbridge, Inc. for its mass notification system to be utilized during disaster situations. The new system, which replaces Blackboard Connect (formerly Connect CTY), allows the City to immediately alert the entire community of serious emergencies or disaster situations, and provide important information and updates throughout the incident. The system also allows the City to send area-specific messages only to those whose registered location is in the affected area.

All telephone landlines in the City are automatically downloaded to the system, but residents are being urged to opt-in and enter additional contact information, such as cell phones, email addresses, etc., to ensure they receive the notifications wherever they are at any given time. Notifications sent by the City will be received on the voice or text communication methods registered by the individual users in priority orders set by each user. Additional features include the option for the City to require confirmation of receipt of a particular notification, GIS mapping, and two-way communication that allows users to submit "on-the-scene reports" with geo-location, pictures and text.

Staff will provide an overview of the Everbridge system and features that will be beneficial to the City in a serious emergency situation.



II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A robbery was reported in the 30800 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The suspect (White male, in his 20's, 5'9"/5'10", 180 to 190 pounds with green eyes and wearing a dark blue towel around the lower half of his face/head) entered the location, pointed a handgun at the clerk and motioned with his head and gun in the direction of the cash register. Help Prevent Package Delivery Thefts

As the Holidays approach, many people have started to shop online or through various catalogs, having their purchases delivered to their doorstep through many different shipping companies. Due to the higher volume of deliveries the Malibu/Lost Hills Sheriff Station would like to remind everyone that during the months of November and December to use caution when having packages delivered at home.

The Malibu/Lost Hills Sheriff Station also recommends the following safety tips:

- Follow the delivery status online so you can try to be available when the package arrives. Some shipping companies and retailers even offer text messages or email to your cell/smart phone to let you know when items have been delivered.
- Choose a shipping option that requires you to sign for delivery.
- Arrange to have the package shipped to another location where someone can receive it.
- On the expected day of arrival, post a note on your door asking the delivery service to leave the package with a trusted neighbor.
- If you do not receive your shipment on time, check with the company of origin and confirm the delivery. If the item was delivered and you did not receive it, report the theft or loss to the original company, the shipping company, and to the Simi Valley Police Department
- Many of these crimes occur during broad daylight. Be alert about suspicious behavior in your neighborhood, especially if you see a delivery truck making the rounds and a vehicle following behind or unfamiliar subjects on foot.
- Your calls can have an impact on crime and criminals. Please continue to partner to prevent crime. To report any suspicious activity please call the Malibu/Lost Hills Sheriff Station at 818 878-1808 or in the case of an emergency dial 911.

INTERVENTIONS

No interventions were held this month.

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. We conducted a monthly parental resource class at Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. This program was developed by our unit and is designed to educate parents about: 1) The current trends in juvenile behavior and delinquency, 2) Alcohol/narcotic awareness and recognition, 3) School policy and campus issues, 4) Gang awareness and negative peer relations, 5) Parental rights and responsibilities and, 6) Parental responses to incorrigible and/or delinquent behavior. We also address the specific concerns relating to the minor's behavior. We educate the minor and their parents of possible criminal behavior and the legal consequences. We offer suggestions and make recommendations to improve the minor's quality of life.
2. Spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with various juvenile resource programs within our community.
3. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Pat Davoren throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our units investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. Made court appearances to testify as witnesses on the part of the People of the State of California and attended court proceedings in cases generated from the City of Malibu. We also investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
7. We met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several

narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.





Community Crime Prevention Tips

Rainy Day Safe Driving Tips

The inclement weather brings driving challenges to everyone. Yearly, wet weather contributes to 1.2 million crashes nationwide. Here are some reminders to help you stay safe and return home to your loved ones.

- 1) If it is raining, turn on your headlights. You will become more visible to each other, and the Vehicle Code requires it. Stay alert.
- 2) Slow down. This will avoid "hydroplaning" and will help your tires stay in contact with the road.
- 3) Allow yourself more braking distance, in case the road oils are still present. Focus on what is 20-30 seconds ahead of your vehicle. If your car has ABS braking, keep firm pressure on the pedal if the system activates.
- 4) If you start to slide or skid, do not slam on the brakes. Continue to steer in the direction in which you want the car to go and lift off the accelerator.
- 5) Use vehicle safety belts. They are proven to save lives.
- 6) Flooding may occur. If you see water that looks deeper than 10-12 inches, do NOT continue into the water.
- 7) An intersection with lights out becomes a 4-way stop.

The Malibu/Lost Hills Station hopes these tips serve as simple reminders about wet weather safe driving. Routine vehicle maintenance is also important. Be sure to check your wipers, tires, brakes, etc. Please drive safe and be sure to call 911 if you see downed power lines or roadway blockages.

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. We conducted a monthly parental resource class at Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. This program was developed by our unit and is designed to educate parents about: 1) The current trends in juvenile behavior and delinquency, 2) Alcohol/narcotic awareness and recognition, 3) School policy and campus issues, 4) Gang awareness and negative peer relations, 5) Parental rights and responsibilities and, 6) Parental responses to incorrigible and/or delinquent behavior. We also address the specific concerns relating to the minor's behavior. We educate the minor and their parents of possible criminal behavior and the legal consequences. We offer suggestions and make recommendations to improve the minor's quality of life.
2. Spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with various juvenile resource programs within our community.
3. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Pat Davoren throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our units investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. Made court appearances to testify as witnesses on the part of the People of the State of California and attended court proceedings in cases generated from the City of Malibu. We also investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally

assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.

7. We met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.
8. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit (i.e., Juvenile Information Forms, Field Interview Cards, Juvenile Automated Index, and citations for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel).
9. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. The Juvenile Intervention Team assisted the COPS Team with Parole Compliance checks in Malibu, Topanga, Calabasas and Westlake Village.
