**The Oral Communication** portion of the agenda is for members of the public to present items which are not listed on the agenda, but are under the subject matter jurisdiction of the Commission. Although no action may be taken, the Commission and staff will follow up, at an appropriate time, on those items needing response. Each speaker is limited to (3) three minutes. Time may be surrendered by deferring (1) one minute to another speaker, not to exceed a total of (8) eight minutes. The speaker wishing to defer time must be present when the item is heard. In order to be recognized and present an item, each speaker must complete and submit to the Recording Secretary a Request to Speak form prior to the beginning of the item being announced by the Chair (forms are available at the entrance to the meeting room). Speakers are taken in the order slips are submitted.

**Items in Consent Calendar Section A** have already been considered by the Commission at a previous meeting where the public was invited to comment, after which a decision was made. These items are not subject to public discussion at this meeting because the vote taken at the previous meeting was final. Resolutions concerning decisions made at previous meetings are for the purpose of memorializing the decision to assure the accuracy of the findings, the prior vote, and any conditions imposed.

**Items in Consent Calendar Section B** have not been discussed previously by the Commission. If discussion is desired, an item may be removed from the Consent Calendar for individual consideration. Commissioners may indicate a negative or abstaining vote on any individual item by so declaring prior to the vote on the motion to adopt the entire Consent Calendar. 

CALL TO ORDER

Chair Saul called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

ROLL CALL

The following persons were recorded in attendance by the Recording Secretary:

ALSO PRESENT: Bob Brager, Public Works Director; Arthur Aladjajian, Public Works Superintendent; Lieutenant Jim Royal, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department; and Mary Linden, Recording Secretary

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mark Russo led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Commissioner Randall seconded a motion to approve the agenda. The motion carried 4-0, Commissioner May absent.

REPORT ON POSTING OF AGENDA

Recording Secretary Linden reported that the agenda for the meeting was properly posted on January 28, 2016.

ITEM 1.A. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

ITEM 1.B. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Chair Saul introduced Mark Russo, Volunteers on Patrol (VOP). Chair Saul announced that a member of VOP would be attending the Commission's future meetings.

Commissioner Randall expressed a concern about inadequate lighting at shopping centers and parking lots. She discussed the community's efforts to preserve dark skies. Commissioner Matlow stated it was the responsibility of the property owners to provide adequate lighting. Commissioner Randall suggested the City urge shopping center

owners to improve lighting in their parking lots. She discussed her recent fall in the Ralphs parking lot.

In response to Chair Saul, Public Works Director Brager discussed a lighting ordinance the Planning Department was working on for the City. Commissioner Randall stated the safety issue often went up against the dark sky issue. She stated it was important to consider both issues when drafting the ordinance.

Commissioner Matlow discussed a new home being built at Cliffside and Fernhill. She stated it included a skate park that would create a public nuisance. She stated she planned to speak at the Planning Commission when the project would be discussed.

Commissioner Randall stated she was no longer receiving notices of PCH Task Force meetings. She requested staff's assistance in getting her back on the email list.

ITEM 2        CONSENT CALENDAR

Commissioner Matlow requested corrections to her comments regarding the Point Dume Traffic Management Community Meeting under item 4.D. of the minutes of the December 2, 2015 meeting.

Commissioner May arrived at 5:16 p.m.

Commissioner May reported that he spoke at a recent Planning Commission meeting regarding parking lot standards. He stated he talked about the Public Safety Commission's recommendation to Council on the issue. He discussed changes to the ordinance suggested by the Planning Commission.

ITEM 2        CONSENT CALENDAR (continued)

ITEM 4 NEW BUSINESS

A. Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets

Recommended Action: 1) Receive and file status updates on projects affecting traffic on PCH and City streets, including: a) Point Dume Traffic Management Community Meeting; b) Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Street Maintenance Project; c) Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) Parking Master Plan; d) El Niño Update; and e) Caltrans maintenance work; and 2) Provide questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans staff.

Commissioner May commended the City's work to seal and slurry City streets and clear shoulders.

Commissioner Matlow discussed ongoing problems with sand blowing from the beach onto Westward Beach Road.

In response to Chair Saul, Public Works Superintendent Aladjajian explained methods for reporting potholes to Caltrans.

In response to Chair Saul, Public Works Director Brager discussed the status of the PCH parking study.

Commissioner May discussed signs that need to be replaced at exits from several local pocket beaches.

Chair Saul inquired about the status of a problem power pole at the end of Broad Beach. Public Works Director Brager reported on staff's recent meeting with Southern California Edison (SCE) about the status of power pole replacement throughout the City. Commissioner Randall requested the problem of insufficient lighting on some power poles be discussed at the next meeting with SCE. Public Works Superintendent Aladjajian stated SCE was considering replacing bulbs in the future. He stated they would continue to bring it up in future meetings.

Commissioner Randall requested clarification of the goal of the parking master plan. Public Works Director Brager explained the City could not discuss parking restrictions with the Coastal Commission until a complete inventory was done. He stated the Coast Commission wants to ensure there will always be enough parking for beach visitors. Commissioner May asked if areas where shoulders were inadequate to exit a vehicle without entering the traffic lane could be designated as no parking zones.

In response to Chair Saul, Public Works Director Brager stated speed limits did not change as the result of a speed study recently completed by Caltrans.

Commissioner Matlow asked if Caltrans is going to install warning signs in areas susceptible to hydroplaning. Public Works Director Brager stated they would discuss the issue with Caltrans during the next conference call. In response to Commissioner Matlow, Public Works Director Brager stated the City and Caltrans cleared culverts and drains prior to and following recent storms.

B. Disaster Mass Notification System

Recommended Action: Receive and file overview of Everbridge, the City's new mass notification system for disaster situations.

Recording Secretary Linden presented the report. She urged the Commissioners to register with Everbridge and help spread the word in the community. She emphasized that Everbridge would be used in disaster situations only and does not replace the e-notifications and advisories sent through the City website.

Lt. Royal stressed how helpful this system could be for the Sheriff's Department's response to emergency situations. He stated the system could notify affected communities before the deputies were able get to the area. He stated the special information collection provided valuable details about the areas to which his deputies would be responding.

The Commissioners suggested options for community outreach. Commissioner Randall suggested the City provide training and assistance for seniors who may need help registering. Commissioner May suggested having someone stationed in shopping centers to help residents register.

In response to Chair Saul, Lt. Royal explained how the Sheriff's Department and City staff would communicate information during disasters.

Commissioner May suggested making cards or flyers with the link to the Everbridge registration page that could be easily distributed. He suggested a supply be given to the VOPs.

C. Public Safety Agency Activity

Recommended Action: Discuss recent Public Safety Agency activities and receive and file monthly activity reports from the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, Fire Department and Lifeguard Division.

Lt. Royal discussed improvements in inter-agency communication. He stated agencies in neighboring areas were on board with sharing information that impacts areas outside their own jurisdictions.

In response to Commissioner Matlow, Lt. Royal explained that parking citations are not included in the Sheriff's monthly traffic collision reports because the tickets are processed through the City. He explained the Enforcement Index and its relation to the level of enforcement of accident-causing violations.

In response to Vice Chair Frost, Lt. Royal requested he be advised of locations where drivers habitually make illegal turns or cross the double yellow lines, so he could have deputies cover those areas.

Vice Chair Frost asked if deputies would enforce the new law prohibiting motorists and cyclists from wearing headphones or sets of two earphones/earbuds.




**DISCUSSION:** The following details activities related to the City's Emergency Preparedness program for December 2015 through February 2016:

- An El Nino preparedness presentation was made to Webster Elementary School PTA. All Malibu public school parents and teachers have now been addressed about this issue.
- Meetings were held with Public Works and Media Information Office staff to ensure readiness and emergency protocols were in-place in anticipation of El Nino activations.
- Staffing for the City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) has been reorganized to ensure all full-time staff members are cross-trained to perform multiple duties within the EOC. Several staff training classes were held to orient all staff members to the new system, and organization charts and position descriptions were distributed.
- The City has changed to a new provider for its disaster notification service. The new company is called Everbridge, and is the national leader in this type of

notification system. Everbridge provided three days of training classes for the new system administrators prior to the City making public announcements about the new product.

- Presentations about the new Everbridge system were made to the Public Works Commission, the Public Safety Commission and at a Council meeting to provide overview information about the system's capabilities and to encourage the public to input their personal contact information into the system.
- The publicity campaign to get residents to register their contact information for the new Everbridge system continues to yield results. As of February 10, 685 individuals have logged into the system to provide contact information.
- Training for responding to an active shooter incident was provided to staff, City Council and members of the City's commissions and committees by members of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. The training highlighted the need for identifying evacuation routes, safe rooms and alert and warning protocols. It also clarified what actions should be taken once law enforcement arrives on-scene. Follow-up training classes will provide information on emergency first aid steps that can be taken by staff to help the wounded before the arrival of advanced medical personnel.
- A very popular Pet First Aid class was held for the public.
- The City has a new disaster supplies storage space at Las Flores Creek Park as part of the new restroom facility recently opened there. Malibu's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) filled the new space with food, water, blankets and more, to support the local community during a disaster.
- A series of CERT training classes was completed at the Paradise Cove Mobilehome Park. A new series of CERT classes begins at City Hall on February 13.
- Regular monthly meetings attended include Volunteers On Patrol, Operational Area-B, California Emergency Services Association and CERT.


**DISCUSSION:** Below are the latest updates on the status of projects in and around Malibu that affect traffic and public safety on PCH and City streets:

- a) Point Dume Traffic Management Community Meeting – In November 2015, the City held a community meeting at the Point Dume Marine Science Elementary School to discuss various options available to improve traffic safety in the Point Dume neighborhood, such as speed humps, signage, speeding, parking and other traffic related issues. Based on input provided by the public at the November community meeting, the City conducted a second community meeting on February 23 to discuss possible recommendations in an effort to create a workable traffic management plan for the Point Dume community.
- b) Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Street Maintenance Project – The contractor has completed all of the pavement dig-outs, asphalt overlay, slurry seal and striping work. The remaining punch list items such as demobilization of equipment and materials, cleanup, as-built drawings, etc., will be completed by mid-March.

- c) El Niño Update – During the February 17 storm event, Malibu received approximately 0.5 to 0.75 inches of rain. During the storm, staff and the City’s maintenance crews monitored and cleared City roads and drainage facilities for any potential storm issues; however, all roads remained open for the duration of the storm. City maintenance crews are re-inspecting City storm drains and removing debris collected along the shoulders.
  
- d) Caltrans Maintenance Work (PCH within Malibu) – According to Caltrans, highway maintenance crews repaired potholes near Zumirez Drive and Trancas Canyon Road. Caltrans crew also cleaned drains between Decker Canyon Road and Trancas Canyon Road, including removing dirt behind the k-rails near Corral Canyon Road.

The Commission may provide staff with a list of questions to be asked during the City’s biweekly conference call with Caltrans. Responses to those questions will be reported back to the Commission at its next Regular meeting.



## II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A resident of Los Angeles was arrested for residential burglary in the 20000 block Big Rock Drive. The suspect attempted to make entry by removing the screen door on a sliding glass door. The victim was inside the residence sleeping when awakened by the noise. When the victim went to investigate, she found the suspect on the roof of the residence. (16-00140)

A commercial burglary was reported in the 22500 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The front door to the business was pried open to gain entry. The ATM machine with U.S. currency and cigarettes were stolen from the location. Video surveillance footage shows three male suspects, possibly Black or Hispanic, prying open the front door and exiting with the ATM machine and cigarettes. They fled in an older model Dodge Durango, four door, white in color with black door guards. Similar incidents have occurred in the jurisdiction of the Los Angeles Police Department. The investigation is on-going. (16-00411)

A vandalism occurred in the area of Heathercliff Road and Pacific Coast Highway. Two City of Malibu bus benches were vandalized by unknown suspect(s) – damage \$3,000. The suspect(s) used a black marker pen to draw multiple swastikas and write numerous statements on the benches. (16-00211)





**COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES**

1. We conducted a monthly parental resource class at Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. This program was developed by our unit and is designed to educate parents about: 1) The current trends in juvenile behavior and delinquency, 2) Alcohol/narcotic awareness and recognition, 3) School policy and campus issues, 4) Gang awareness and negative peer relations, 5) Parental rights and responsibilities and, 6) Parental responses to incorrigible and/or delinquent behavior. We also address the specific concerns relating to the minor's behavior. We educate the minor and their parents of possible criminal behavior and the legal consequences. We offer suggestions and make recommendations to improve the minor's quality of life.
2. Spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with various juvenile resource programs within our community.
3. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Pat Davoren throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our units investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. Made court appearances to testify as witnesses on the part of the People of the State of California and attended court proceedings in cases generated from the City of Malibu. We also investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
7. We met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.

8. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit (i.e., Juvenile Information Forms, Field Interview Cards, Juvenile Automated Index, and citations for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel).
9. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. The Juvenile Intervention Team assisted the COPS Team with Parole Compliance checks in Malibu, Topanga, Calabasas and Westlake Village.
11. Investigated 5 allegation of child abuse.

## **SENIORS CAN STOP SCOUNDRELS AND SCAMS**

FINANCIAL FRAUD CAN BE DIFFICULT TO RECOGNIZE. THIS TYPE OF FRAUD CAN INCLUDE IDENTITY THEFT, FAKE CHECK AND WIRE TRANSFER SCAMS, INVESTMENT AND CREDIT CARD FRAUD, AND BOGUS ONLINE CHARITABLE SOLICITATIONS. UNFORTUNATELY, ONLY ONE IN FIVE OF THESE CRIMES IS REPORTED.

### **TIPS**

- 1) It's shrewd, not rude to hang up on a suspicious telemarketer.
- 2) Don't give personal information to people you don't know unless you initiated the contact.
- 3) Don't let yourself get pressured into a verbal agreement or signing a contract.
- 4) Be skeptical of online charitable solicitations and other online offers. If interested, ask to receive the information in the mail and check to be sure the company is legitimate.
- 5) Never agree to pay for products or services in advance.

6) Get estimates and ask for references on home repair offers and other products or services.

7) If you suspect fraud, contact your local law enforcement agency.


