The Oral Communication portion of the agenda is for members of the public to present items which are not listed on the agenda, but are under the subject matter jurisdiction of the Commission. Although no action may be taken, the Commission and staff will follow up, at an appropriate time, on those items needing response. Each speaker is limited to (3) three minutes. Time may be surrendered by deferring (1) one minute to another speaker, not to exceed a total of (8) eight minutes. The speaker wishing to defer time must be present when the item is heard. In order to be recognized and present an item, each speaker must complete and submit to the Recording Secretary a Request to Speak form prior to the beginning of the item being announced by the Chair (forms are available at the entrance to the meeting room). Speakers are taken in the order slips are submitted.

Items in Consent Calendar Section A have already been considered by the Commission at a previous meeting where the public was invited to comment, after which a decision was made. These items are not subject to public discussion at this meeting because the vote taken at the previous meeting was final. Resolutions concerning decisions made at previous meetings are for the purpose of memorializing the decision to assure the accuracy of the findings, the prior vote, and any conditions imposed.

Items in Consent Calendar Section B have not been discussed previously by the Commission. If discussion is desired, an item may be removed from the Consent Calendar for individual consideration. Commissioners may indicate a negative or abstaining vote on any individual item by so declaring prior to the vote on the motion to adopt the entire Consent Calendar. The Commission first will take up the items for which public speaker requests have been submitted. Public speakers shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.


Items in New Business are items which are appearing for the first time for formal action. Public comment shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.

CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chair Frost called the meeting to order at 5:05 p.m.

ROLL CALL

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Acting Public Works Director DuBoux led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Commissioner Randall seconded a motion to approve the agenda. The motion carried 4-0, Chair Saul absent.

REPORT ON POSTING OF AGENDA

Recording Secretary Linden reported that the agenda for the meeting was properly posted on March 30, 2016.

ITEM 2 CONSENT CALENDAR

Recording Secretary Linden reported that the meeting date in the minutes attached to Item No. 2.B.1. incorrectly showed the date as March 2, 2015. She stated the year would be corrected to 2016 in the approved version of the minutes.

MOTION Commissioner Randall moved and Vice Chair Frost seconded a motion to approve the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 4-0, Chair Saul absent.

ITEM 3 OLD BUSINESS

ITEM 4 NEW BUSINESS

- A. Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets
Recommended Action: 1) Receive and file status updates on projects affecting traffic on PCH and City streets, including: a) Point Dume Traffic Management Community Meeting; b) El Niño update; and c) Caltrans maintenance work; and 2) Provide questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans staff.

Commissioner May thanked staff for new signs installed near entrances to pocket beaches. He requested faded or defaced signs be replaced near Malibu Seafood and Surfrider Beach. He discussed paddles replaced at Las Flores Creek Road and areas of PCH that need to be repaved or have potholes filled.

Commissioner Matlow requested a survey be done to identify faded, damaged or missing parking signs on PCH and at the beaches that make the City's No Overnight Parking ordinance unenforceable. She expressed concern about speed humps scheduled to be installed in Point Dume. She requested the Commission review where the speed humps would be installed before construction begins. Acting Public Works Director DuBoux stated the locations were determined by the Traffic Engineer and speed humps would only be installed on flat sections of roadway. Commissioner Matlow suggested new speed limits be stenciled on the street.

In response to Vice Chair Frost, Public Works Superintendent Aladjajian explained how work items in the Point Dume Traffic Management Plan would be scheduled and implemented. In response to Commissioner Matlow, Acting Public Works Director DuBoux confirmed that clearance of encroachments would be noticed to affected residents.

Guy Blake, Malibu Volunteers on Patrol (VOP), stated VOP provided parking enforcement at El Matador Beach over the past weekend. He discussed how signs were observed to be removed and disposed or illegally placed.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Public Works Superintendent Aladjajian stated that Caltrans right of way limits continue to be an issue for the La Costa crosswalk project. He stated the City was considering requesting Caltrans take the lead. Commissioner Randall volunteered to go to the La Costa area's homeowners association to request its assistance in convincing the property owners to cooperate.

Commissioner Randall discussed rumors that installation of guardrails on Malibu Canyon Road was being considered. Public Works Superintendent Aladjajian stated he was unaware of a project to add more guardrails. He reported that the County of Los Angeles installed K-rails as a temporary measure while they decide how to replace existing guardrails that are in need of repair. Commissioner Randall asked if there was a specific reason it had not been done before. Commissioner Matlow stated installation of guardrails on canyon roads was discussed by the Commission years ago. She suggested the issue be re-visited and County representatives be asked to attend the Commission's meeting.

Lt. Royal discussed a Malibu resident's request submitted to the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works to have guardrails installed on Malibu Canyon Road.

Commissioner May discussed a resident's concern about safety at the intersection of Kanan Dume Road and Mulholland Highway.

B. Public Safety Agency Activity

Recommended Action: Discuss recent Public Safety Agency activities and receive and file monthly activity reports from the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, Fire Department and Lifeguard Division.

Lt. Royal requested Mr. Blake discuss increased VOP parking enforcement in Point Dume. Mr. Blake stated approximately 20 to 40 citations were issued on weekends. He stated illegal parking ebbs and flows with the number of visitors. He discussed concentrated efforts on popular beach overflow parking areas. Lt. Royal stated deputies were also issuing more citations for moving violations in Point Dume. He stated that, on average, citations were issued in fairly equal numbers to residents and non-residents.

Lt. Royal explained how Sheriff's Deputies use discretion about which violations to cite while on patrol. He discussed how deployment is based on accident data. He stated many violations are observed when no law enforcement is there, but the violators are more likely to obey the law when a deputy is visible. He expressed appreciation for the assistance of the VOP. Commissioner Matlow requested the patrol vehicles move regularly through all Malibu neighborhoods.

Lt. Royal discussed the arrest last week of an individual alleged to be responsible for two residential burglaries.

Commissioner Matlow requested an update on the accident involving three juveniles in a golf cart that occurred recently in Paradise Cove. She asked if the parents were cited.

Lt. Royal stated he would report back on the golf cart accident, the watch store robbery and educational articles in the local papers.



Staff suggests the following assignments from the current year be carried over as recommendations for assignment in FY 2016-2017:


- Review and make a recommendation on the preliminary design of the Civic Center Widening Project

The following assignments from FY 2015-2016 are not included in staff's recommendation for FY 2016-2017:

- Assignment #2: Make recommendations for solutions to parking concerns on Grasswood Avenue. This issue was incorporated into the Point Dume Traffic Management Plan, which was discussed by the Commission in 2015 and approved for implementation by the City Council on March 14, 2016.
- Assignment #3: Make recommendations for solutions to parking concerns on Fernhill Drive. This issue was also incorporated into the Point Dume Traffic Management Plan, which was approved for implementation by the City Council on March 14, 2016.
- Assignment #4: Make a recommendation on the establishment of new parking lot safety standards. This was discussed by the Commission in 2015 and an ordinance (Ordinance No. 403) establishing the new standards was adopted by the City Council on March 28, 2016.



Subject: 2016 Summer Enforcement Team Proposal

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Review the Sheriff's Department proposal for the 2016 Summer Enforcement Team deployment and recommend that the City Council approve the proposal as part of the Sheriff's Budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017.

DISCUSSION: The Sheriff's Department prepares an annual proposal for additional staffing allocated and deployed during the City's peak visitor season, from Memorial Day through Labor Day, with one additional weekend following Labor Day. The cost of the team is calculated by utilizing the hourly law enforcement rate, as averaged for each category of law enforcement personnel, for Contract Cities. The rate is calculated by the County's Auditor Controller's Office and is published by the Sheriff's Department. The anticipated staffing level per day may be adjusted due to the projected daily beach attendance.

The 2016 Summer Enforcement Team officially deploys on Memorial Day weekend, beginning Saturday, May 28. The team will consist of the equivalent of one (1) Sergeant, six (6) Deputies, one (1) dedicated Traffic Deputy, two (2) Motorcycle Deputies, two (2) Community Service Assistants, one (1) Parking Control Officer as relief, and secretarial support staff. One (1) Lieutenant will work specific weekend days only. On Memorial Day, one (1) additional Sergeant will be deployed due to the increased crowds. With the exception of the Memorial Day holiday on Monday, May 30, the team will deploy only on weekends, for eight hours per team member per day until the July 4th weekend.

Beginning Sunday, July 3, the Summer Enforcement Team deployment will increase by two (2) Deputies for the remainder of the summer months. The total deployment will then consist of one (1) Sergeant, eight (8) Deputies, and one (1) dedicated Traffic Deputy


deployed throughout the weekdays and weekends. One (1) Lieutenant will work specific weekend and days only. In addition, two (2) Motor Deputies, two (2) Community Services Assistants, and one (1) Parking Control Officer will deploy on weekends and holidays during this time. Lastly, Volunteers on Patrol (VOP) will assist the team as needed. After July 1, all personnel will be deployed for ten (10) hours per day to provide maximum coverage during peak summer months.

The Summer Enforcement Team will officially conclude its deployment on Labor Day, September 5. There will be no team deployment between Tuesday and Friday, September 6-9. The Summer Enforcement Team Sergeant will begin to administratively prepare for the summer deployment on May 18, and will continue until the deployment of the team commences. There will be two team training days prior to deployment. At the conclusion of the summer deployment, the Team Sergeant will be given four days to complete all necessary paperwork and clean and store all equipment.

Administrative and clerical staff will be utilized throughout the summer to track and process all documentation (citations, crime reports, etc.) generated by the Summer Enforcement Team. The team will also be augmented with one (1) additional Sergeant and additional deputies, if necessary, on Memorial Day, 4th of July, and Labor Day weekends, due to the extremely large number of visitors on these weekends.

At the conclusion of the 2016 Summer Enforcement Team operation, a full report will be prepared and presented to the Public Safety Commission for review.

Subject: Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets

RECOMMENDED ACTION: 1) Receive and file status updates on projects affecting traffic on PCH and City streets, including: a) Point Dume Traffic Management Plan; b) Caltrans Shoreline Stabilization and Protection Project; and c) Caltrans maintenance work; and 2) Provide questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans staff.

DISCUSSION: Below are the latest updates on the status of projects in and around Malibu that affect traffic and public safety on PCH and City streets:

- a) Point Dume Traffic Management Plan – The following status updates indicate work done to improve traffic safety in the Point Dume area, as directed by the City Council at its March 14, 2016 meeting:
- 1) Install speed humps on Portshhead Road from Pacific Coast Highway to Boniface Drive – Completed
 - 2) Install six radar speed advisory signs throughout the Point Dume neighborhood and on Busch Drive – Project currently out to bid; deadline to submit bids is May 19, 2016
 - 3) Install traffic lane edge striping on Grasswood Avenue and Fernhill Drive – Scheduled on April 29, 2016
 - 4) Install a crosswalk at Heathercliff Road and Dume Drive – Scheduled on April 29, 2016


- 5) Lower the posted speed limit on Bluewater Road, Wildlife Road and Cliffside Drive from 30 miles per hour to 25 miles per hour – Signs have been ordered
- 6) Require removal of landscape encroachments, with the exception of mature trees, by private property owners into the public right-of-way – Nothing to report at this time

Staff will continue to provide updates on the status of unfinished measures at upcoming Commission meetings.

- b) Caltrans Shoreline Stabilization and Protection Project (PCH, from Topanga Canyon Boulevard to Coastline Drive) – Contractor repair crews continue to rebuild the shoreline and place rocks (rip rap), repair damaged pavement, culverts, and drains, and other roadway infrastructure. Work on this project is expected to be completed by June 2016.
- c) Caltrans Maintenance Work (PCH within Malibu) – According to Caltrans, highway maintenance crews performed pavement repairs on southbound PCH near Big Rock Drive. Additional pavement repairs were performed on PCH near Zumirez Drive, Portshead Road and Heathercliff Road.

The Commission may provide staff with a list of questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans. Responses to those questions will be reported back to the Commission at its next Regular meeting.



II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A robbery was reported in the 3800 block of Cross Creek Road. A suspect entered the location and immediately pepper sprayed an employee. 

SCHOOL ISSUES

Investigated and contacted suspects (Malibu High students) regarding assault with a deadly weapon. Arrested 2 subjects and transported them to Sylmar Juvenile Hall.

Contacted Malibu High School administrator and students regarding a fight pending at a house party.

INTERVENTIONS

Contacted Malibu High School parent regarding son sexting.

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. We conducted a monthly parental resource class at the Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. This program was developed by our unit and was designed to educate parents about: 1) The current trends in juvenile behavior and delinquency, 2) Alcohol/narcotic awareness and recognition, 3) School policy and campus issues, 4) Gang awareness and negative peer relations, 5) Parental rights and responsibilities and, 6) Parental responses to incorrigible and/or delinquent behavior. We also addressed the specific concerns relating to the minor's behavior. We educate the minor and their parents of possible criminal behavior and the legal consequences. We offer suggestions and make recommendations to improve the minor's quality of life.
2. Spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with various juvenile resource programs within our community.
3. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Pat Davoren throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. Made court appearances to testify as witnesses on the part of the People of the State of California and attended court proceedings in cases generated from the city of Malibu. We also investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.

7. We met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.
8. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit (i.e., Juvenile Information Forms, Field Interview Cards, Juvenile Automated Index, and citations for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel).
9. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. The Juvenile Intervention Team assisted the COPS Team with Parole Compliance checks in Malibu, Topanga, Calabasas and Westlake Village.
11. Investigated 5 allegations of child abuse.
12. Worked on creating a Juvenile Community Hour Log sheet and looked for locations where the juveniles can serve their community hours.
13. Attended SARB hearing.
14. Attended Choices.
15. Went to Las Virgenes School District to talk to parents that have their children in local schools about cyber safety.

1. Prepared and distributed the crime prevention newsletter/community tips to the chamber of commerce, school districts, residents, and homeowners associations.
2. Have quarterly meeting with Malibu VOP team to go over safety and training issues. Talked to VOPs about ways to make the program better. Complete hiring of three new members.
3. Spoke to citizens via phone and in the station lobby regarding community, crime prevention, traffic, and El Nino related issues or questions.
4. Reviewed, conditioned, approved and emailed several DRC, TUP, and ABC routing sheets.
5. Review seven movie permits and hire deputies to staff the jobs.
6. Follow up with neighborhood watch leaders and assist them with issues in their communities.
7. Maintain the volunteer program by reviewing new applications, conducting background checks, performing live-scan fingerprints, interviewing applicants, training, and recruiting.
8. Attended the "Friends of the Arson Watch & Disaster Services (FAWDS)" meeting. Spoke with Brad Davis about CERT.
9. Attended weekly "Coffee with a Deputy" meeting at the Malibu Kitchen. "Coffee with a Deputy" allows the Malibu community the opportunity to meet with their local law enforcement agency in a casual setting and have an open discussion on local matters.
10. Meet with numerous local business owners to go over security and safety concerns. Put the decoy car near some of their business to help prevent crime.

Neighborhood Safety Tips For Parents

Unfortunately no neighborhood is completely immune to crime. However, there are steps you can take to help keep your family and your neighborhood safe.

- **Know where your children are.** Have your children tell you or ask permission before leaving the house and give them a time to check in or be home. When possible, have them leave a phone number of where they will be.
- **Help children learn important phone numbers.** Have your children practice reciting their home phone number and address, and your work and cell phone numbers. Most of these numbers are on their cell phone speed dial and they don't know them.
- **Set limits on where your children can go in your neighborhood.** Do you want them crossing busy roads? Are there certain homes or shopping centers in your neighborhood that you don't want your children to go to?
- **Get to know your children's friends.** Meet their parents before letting your children to go to their home and keep a list of their phone numbers. If you can't meet their parents, call and talk to them. Ask what your children might do at their house and if they will be supervised.
- **Choose a safe house in your neighborhood.** Pick a neighbor's house where your children can go if they need help. Point out other places they can go for help, like stores, libraries, and police stations.
- **Teach children to settle arguments with words, not fists.** Role-play talking out problems, walking away from fist fights, and what to do when confronted with bullies. Remind them that taunting and teasing can hurt friends and make enemies.
- **Work together with your neighbors.** Watch out for suspicious and unusual behavior in your neighborhood. Get to know your neighbors and their children so you can look out for one another.






