Although no action may be taken, the Commission and staff will follow up, at an appropriate time, on those items needing response. Each speaker is limited to (3) three minutes. Time may be surrendered by deferring (1) one minute to another speaker, not to exceed a total of (8) eight minutes. The speaker wishing to defer time must be present when the item is heard. In order to be recognized and present an item, each speaker must complete and submit to the Recording Secretary a Request to Speak form prior to the beginning of the item being announced by the Chair (forms are available at the entrance to the meeting room). Speakers are taken in the order slips are submitted.

Items in Consent Calendar Section A have already been considered by the Commission at a previous meeting where the public was invited to comment, after which a decision was made. These items are not subject to public discussion at this meeting because the vote taken at the previous meeting was final. Resolutions concerning decisions made at previous meetings are for the purpose of memorializing the decision to assure the accuracy of the findings, the prior vote, and any conditions imposed.

Items in Consent Calendar Section B have not been discussed previously by the Commission. If discussion is desired, an item may be removed from the Consent Calendar for individual consideration. Commissioners may indicate a negative or abstaining vote on any individual item by so declaring prior to the vote on the motion to adopt the entire Consent Calendar. The Commission first will take up the items for which public speaker requests have been submitted. Public speakers shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.

Chair Randall called the meeting to order at 5:33 p.m.

ITEM 4 NEW BUSINESS

- A. Program Cancellation and Refund Policy
Recommended Action: 1) Review the proposed Program Cancellation and Refund Policy and 2) Recommend the Program Cancellation and Refund Policy for City Council approval.

Recreation Supervisor Gallo presented the proposed refund policy. The new policy includes an adjustment to the process in which a refund may be requested, length of time refunds must be requested before the beginning of the program, the City's method of issuing a refund and the length of time a credit will remain on a customer's account.

Commissioner Israel stated that she would like to review the effectiveness of the new policy after the completion of the summer 2017 session.

MOTION Commissioner Principe moved and Commissioner Parks seconded a motion to recommend the changes to the Program Cancellation and Refund Policy for City Council approval. The motion carried 4-0, Vice Chair Petretti absent.

- B. Parks and Recreation Commission Mid-Year Activity Report
Recommended Action: Review the mid-year Commission report and approve sending the update to City Council.

The mid-year activity report was presented by Recreation Manager Riesgo.

In response to Chair Randall, Parks and Recreation Director Bobbett stated the contractor was working with City staff to review and revise the original plan of the Bluffs Parkland Project. He stated that staff would update the Commission when more information was available.

MOTION Chair Randall moved and Commissioner Israel seconded a motion to recommend sending the update to the City Council with the addition of the Program

Cancellation and Refund Policy. The motion carried 3-0, Vice Chair Petretti and Commissioner Principe absent.

C. Trancas Canyon Park Field Use

Recommended Action: Provide a recommendation to City Council to allow the Parks and Recreation Department to conduct games for Coach Pitch Baseball at Trancas Canyon Park on a trial basis for the 2017 season.

Recreation Manager Riesgo presented the report and stated Coach Pitch Baseball had minimal impact on the field and would be a controlled environment with City staff present at all times. She stated there were no lines or bleachers needed and there would be a maximum of 60 people at the Park during the practice games. She stated Coach Pitch Baseball was currently held at Malibu High School.

Pat Healy stated that there was a legal settlement in 2010 that prohibited organized sports being played at Trancas Canyon Park.

Marianne Riggins stated that it was a great use of the Park since the minimum number of hours and impact was appropriate for the multipurpose field.

In response to Ms. Healy, Recreation Manager Riesgo stated she had reviewed the Park deed restrictions and City Council Resolution and had not seen any limitations in regards to games. She stated staff had not had an opportunity to review the information with the City Attorney.

Parks and Recreation Director Bobbett stated the City Attorney would review the restrictions before the matter would go to the Council

MOTION Chair Randall moved and Commissioner Parks seconded a motion to recommend the City Council allow the Parks and Recreation Department to conduct games for Coach Pitch Baseball at Trancas Canyon Park on a trial basis for the 2017 season. The motion passed 4-0, Vice Chair Petretti absent.

Commissioner Israel left the meeting at 6:08 p.m.

ITEM 5 STAFF UPDATES

Recreation Manager Riesgo provided the Commissioners with updates which included:

- o Trancas Field Community Outreach had been completed and a report would be presented at the January Commission meeting.
- o Park Maintenance included tree pruning at Las Flores Creek Park, shrub trimming at Legacy Park, as well as turf renovations at Trancas Canyon Park and Malibu Bluffs Park.

- Upcoming special events included the following: Malibu Teen Film Festival on January 13, 2017; Touch-a-Truck on January 21, 2017; Library Speaker Series on January 31, 2017; and the Malibu Student Art Show on February 11, 2017.
- The Funny Zoo exhibit would end on December 19, 2017, and the Fred Ward Photo Exhibit would end in January 2017 with a new art exhibit being installed in Malibu City Hall in March 2017.
- The Youth Basketball League had 263 registered players.

DISCUSSION: During the month of December 2016, the following activities, events, projects, and programs were coordinated by the Parks and Recreation Department:

RECREATION

Community Classes: On December 5, the Children's Ballet classes culminated with a performance for friends and family at Malibu City Hall. Students danced to holiday music choreographed by instructor Marisa Boyle. City staff received positive feedback about the instructor and participants are looking forward to registering for the winter 2017 session.

Point Dume Marine Science School Afterschool Enrichment Classes: Staff attended Point Dume Marine Science School's (PDMSS) PTA meeting on December 14 and distributed information about the City's afterschool enrichment program to parents and administrators. New programs such as gymnastics, etiquette and art have been added to the winter 2017 season which will begin January 23.

Public Art: The four animal sculptures associated with the temporary Public Art Installation, Funny Zoo, were removed from Legacy Park on December 19. The curator, Bernard Scoffie, thanked the City of Malibu, members of the Cultural Arts Commission and Parks

and Recreation Commission for supporting the exhibit. The exposure of the sculptures brought education and awareness to animal conservation and the public arts.

Senior Center: The annual Winter Showcase took place on December 2 with performances by the Malibu Senior Choir, the Twilight Tappers and the Malibu Jazz Ensemble. Senior Center Volunteer Vin Joshi emceed the event which had over 150 people in attendance.

The Senior Center partnered with two different organizations, Covered California and the Point Dume Marine Science School, to host free activities and workshops in December: Covered California offered a free presentation on their insurance plan offered by the state with seven people in attendance. Children from Point Dume Marine Science School sang holiday songs for seniors and City staff on December 7.

Seniors visited the Santa Monica History Museum on December 7, then went to the Santa Monica Farmer's Market for lunch along with grocery and holiday shopping.

The Silver Fox Walk was held on December 8 at the Point Dume Headlands. Volunteer Suzanne Guldemann, a local newspaper writer and historian, lead the hike with 14 people in attendance.

The Monthly Luncheon was on December 15 and featured entertainment by the Malibu Senior Choir. The lunch which was catered by PC Greens included turkey, stuffing and side dishes for diners in attendance. For the past several years, attendees have been asked to RSVP for each luncheon due to its popularity which resulted in 100 RSVP's. With only 82 of the 100 in attendance, staff will continue to overbook luncheons based on the amount of "no-shows".

Sports: The 2016-2017 Youth Basketball League began on December 2 and 3 at Malibu High School with 265 participants playing in this year's league. Teams will play each week on either Friday or Saturday until mid-February when the season ends.

The Itty Bitty Basketball program for children ages three to five reached maximum enrollment with 15 registered participants. Instructors from Momentum Academies teach children basic basketball fundamentals in a fun, non-competitive environment.

The Middle School Cheerleading Squad will be performing during halftime of Friday Middle School Basketball League games during the 2016-2017 season. The squad has been practicing since September and the cheer coaches have been impressed with the students' enthusiasm and dedication to the squad.

Six outdoor basketball courts at Malibu High School were recently updated with Plexiglas backboards. The upgrades will improve the quality and amount of practice options available for the youth and middle school basketball teams.

City staff met with the School District's Facility Permits Department and the Malibu High School Athletic Department on December 19 to review spring scheduling, facility conditions and potential improvement projects.

The Department was recently awarded the 2016 Innovative Sports Activity Award from the Southern California Municipal Athletic Association (SCMAF). The Parent and Me Sports Program (Tennis, Basketball and T-Ball) was selected by SCMAF due to the program's efforts to increase youth sports participation by encouraging and practicing new sports skills in a non-competitive environment. SCMAF was established in 1949 and is a non-profit organization comprised primarily of municipal recreation agencies throughout Southern California to support initiatives such as scholarship programs, advocacy for fitness and wellness, and promoting sportsmanship and fair play.

PARK MAINTENANCE

Bluffs Park: The turf is currently under renovation on the multi-purpose field and baseball fields at Malibu Bluffs Park. The renovation program includes soil aeration, dethatching, over-seed with a 50/50 blend of perennial rye and Kentucky bluegrass, seed cover, organic fertilizer and gypsum. Temporary chain-link fencing was installed around the perimeter of the multipurpose field and the baseball field gates were locked to prevent unauthorized access during the establishment period.

Two playground sign posts were replaced due to decay of the wooden support post beneath the surface. The new posts were painted and installed into concrete footings for extra support and the existing signs, which were in good condition, were re-installed onto the new posts.

The shrubs and trees at the parking lot trail head were pruned along with removal of debris from the creek to reduce the chance of trail washout from heavy rains. The creek runs beneath one of the Bluffs Park trails through four separate 3" drainage pipes.

Staff placed sandbags along trail areas most susceptible to erosion during rain storms. Three locations along the trail tend to fail under moderate to heavy rainfall and require installation of waddles or sandbags to minimize damage.

Equestrian Park: Dirt and debris were removed from all of the v-ditches, trails, roadway and parking lot due to the heavy rains and flooding. Sand bags were strategically placed throughout the park to protect against flooding and erosion.

Las Flores Park: Staff positioned sandbags along the trails to reduce damage and run-off in preparation for the winter rain storms.

Plants were installed throughout the park to replace lost, missing and dead plant material in addition to adding 5 yards of mulch.

Legacy Park: Eleven dead or dying trees were replaced with native plants throughout the park. Due to harsh soil conditions, the trees were not able to tolerate the environment of the park. The plants that replaced the trees have been doing well and are able to withstand the elevated salt conditions.

Michael Landon Center: Staff acquired a cost proposal for painting the interior and exterior of the building which will be used to help plan for next fiscal year's budget. Staff also acquired a proposal for replacing and upgrading the exterior light fixtures with new low energy LED fixtures. The current fixtures are high energy use Halogen incandescent bulbs that are aging and require heavy maintenance.

Trancas Canyon Park: The multipurpose field was closed for six weeks while undergoing an annual turf renovation. Staff removed temporary fencing from the multipurpose field and re-opened it for full use on December 5.

DEPARTMENT STAFF

Katie Gallo was installed as 2017 Southern California Municipal Athletic Association (SCMAF) Channel Cities Region President on December 14, 2016. Katie will represent municipal recreation professionals in the Southern California region who work towards the development and growth adult and youth sports programs. The agency provides member education programs, professional development opportunities, networking, rules and coaching resources. SCMAF also supports important initiatives such as scholarship programs, advocacy for fitness and wellness, and promoting sportsmanship and fair play. The region covers Malibu to San Luis Obispo.

Subject: Trancas Field Community Outreach

RECOMMENDED ACTION: 1) Review the Trancas Field community outreach results; and 2) Make a recommendation to City Council regarding potential use of the property.

DISCUSSION: On October 10, 2016, the City Council directed the Parks and Recreation Commission to conduct public outreach meetings to solicit input regarding the use of Trancas Field.

The Parks and Recreation Commission discussed and approved a plan at the Special meeting on October 4, 2016 that consisted of three different elements: community workshops, stakeholder focus group meetings and a community-wide questionnaire.

Three community workshops were held during October and November 2016. The first workshop, which was geared toward teens and youth, took place on October 17 and had 20 participants in attendance. Popular ideas from this workshop included an outdoor pool, a skate park, a bike pump track and an adventure facility. The least favorable ideas were athletic fields and a Senior Center.

The second workshop on November 2 was held at the Malibu West Beach Club and resulted in a variety of ideas. Most participants favored either preserving the space and leaving the project area untouched or building a skate park. Most attendees agreed that they did not want any structures or athletic fields built on the site. 96 people attended the workshop with the majority in attendance being from western Malibu.

The final workshop was held at Malibu City Hall and had 55 people in attendance on November 30. The results were similar to the second workshop with most people favoring

preservation of the space. The majority of the group also voiced their support for a skate park, but preferred that it be built at Malibu Bluffs Park or the Crummer Lot Property.

Over 90 people were invited to attend one of the stakeholder focus group meetings that took place on November 2, 2016 and November 7, 2016. A total of 10 community members attended these meetings with several ideas resulting from the meeting. These ideas included preservation and rehabilitation of the open space and wildlife, seating areas, natural shade, vista points, a butterfly garden, outdoor educational opportunities for children, native gardens and demonstration gardens.

The Community-wide Questionnaire was made available on the City's Website from October 12 through December 12, 2016. The questionnaire was divided into sections related to park amenity options such as trails, facilities/buildings, athletic fields, hard surface athletic facilities and other recreational amenities. Individuals were asked to rank their priorities and were also given the opportunity to select an "other" option of which they could give additional details about their ideas for the land.

The City received 446 responses with the highest percentage of responses coming from community members who live near Trancas Field (37%) and Point Dume (29%). The majority of people who responded requested that the area be designated as Natural Open Space (56%). Other popular responses were Trails (40%) and building a Skate Park (36%).

Additionally, the questionnaire addressed concerns raised from the development of Trancas Field. Out of the total responses received, Disturbing the Natural Habitat (62%), Increased Traffic (56%) and Adequate Parking (49%) were the major concerns.

The Commission is asked to review the Trancas Field community outreach results and make a recommendation to City Council regarding a potential use for the property.



Q2 What would you like to do or see at Trancas Field? (Select all that apply)





FYI, commentary for community garden aired on KBU, and radiomalibu.net, and appearing in various websites and social media: A COMMUNITY GARDEN FOR TRANCAS FIELD If Malibu's subdued City Hall is being praised for anything these dog days on the local campaign trail, it is the pending purchase of Trancas Field. Everyone seems to be in agreement that the city buying the 35 acre parcel off Trancas Canyon Road and the PCH for 11 plus million dollars, and paying about \$120,000 in attorney fees, is a good deal for all. It not only ends a protracted city lawsuit to thwart the development of the sloping site for various residential plans of arbitrary densities, but also presents western Malibu with a major park and focal point. But as sure as the tides rise and fall on nearby Zuma Beach, how the park is going to be developed is sure to touch off a healthy debate. Just how passive the park and how much acreage would be hardscaped for possible amenities? And for whom: West Malibu, all of Malibu, the region? Already there has been talk about a skateboard park, a library branch, and picnic grounds with parking for the Zuma overflow, a few steps away. All are getting mixed reaction, at least among the denizens of the nearby Trancas Canyon dog park, which draws a vocal contingent from West Malibu. The city is now soliciting suggestions, so here in mine: that a slice of the site be modestly developed as a community garden. Specifically, I envision a collection of small plots tended by locals, producing vegetables, fruits and flowers, for themselves and for sharing, connecting to the environment, and each other in a singular commonality, sustaining the park with people and purpose. For the record, I have previously, vainly, proposed this for the Civic Center and Bluff and Legacy parks. Though politely received, of course, City Hall did nothing, the proposal not having been suggested by a councilperson or cohort, or by a one of the cadre of city consultants. If it is not their idea, or cannot be packaged simply by special interests and handed to them, the powers-that-be tends to dismiss it. Smile as they do, the current City Hall crowd I feel unfortunately suffers from a touch of paranoia, which tends to cancel out their megalomania. But it IS a good idea, that I feel is all the more appropriate at present, given the rising concern for Malibu's threatened environment and waning sense of community. And talk about a sustainability city. The gardens indeed have been proven a great success everywhere, be they successors of the fondly remembered "victory gardens" of World War Two, to large "greening" projects to preserve natural areas, and to urban revitalization efforts. And according to a book just out, gardens also have been found to be a great teaching and socializing tool for teenagers. Entitled "Growing A Life," subtitled: Teen Gardeners Harvest Food, Health and Joy" it is an inspiring account of how gardening programs in six schools across the country transformed the lives of students, in their words and the author's, Illene Pevac. Published by the New Village Press, it is a rare how-to-book that I found goes beyond the clichés, to prompt the question for me why not in environmentally conscious Malibu, with its benign climate, spectacular setting and a Trancas Field awaiting a community purpose. And also hopefully soon its own school district, which could distinguish itself, initiating a gardening program. No doubt this is to be continued.
